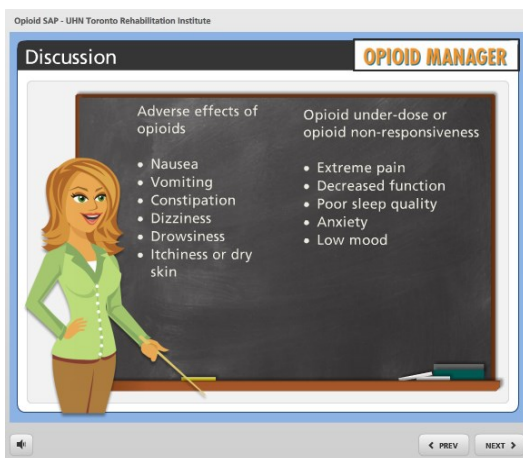


Online Opioid Self-Assessment Program

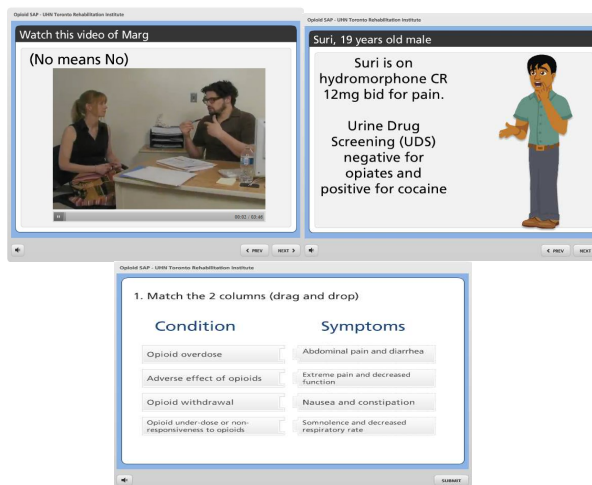
The Online Opioid Self-Assessment Program (SAP) was developed to help participants close the gap between knowledge and action in the use of opioids for chronic non-cancer pain. Using the Canadian Opioid Guideline, this interactive program will guide physicians and prescribers in the monitoring of long-term opioid therapy, the detection of situations involving misuse, including addiction and the appropriate response to such situations.

The content of our Online Opioid SAP will be primarily based on the 24 recommendations of the Canadian Opioid Guideline.



Assessment Areas

- Opioid overdose: risks, diagnosis and management
- Opioid addiction: risks, diagnosis and management
- Urine drug screening
- Switching Opioids
- Tapering and stopping Opioids
- General Knowledge



Knowledge Testing

Our online program includes knowledge tests throughout each module that includes multiple-choice questions, short answer questions, matching or true/false statements. At the end of each module, the participants will receive feedback on their score.

A final test consisting of 10 questions will be presented at the end of the SAP and a passing score of 80% will be required to receive CME credits.
