

## Longitudinal interviews

*For the first interviews, use “over the last couple of weeks” rather than “since we last spoke.”*

1. **Warm up:** Can you tell me how you have generally found the LIA since we last spoke?
2. At the moment, how are your relationships with your tutor, and other practice staff? What about patients? And what about your peers?
3. Have there been aspects of the course, or any situations since we last spoke, that you found particularly worthwhile or valuable?
4. Have you had any interactions with any patients since we last spoke that you felt were particularly meaningful to you?
5. Have you had the opportunity to follow any patients' journeys? If so, what was this like?
6. Have you had any experiences since we last spoke that have made you feel more like a doctor?
7. Do you think that any aspects of your identity has influenced your experiences on the LIA? If so, how?
8. Has there been anything that you have found challenging or difficult since we last spoke that you could tell me about?
9. Do you think the LIA is preparing you for practice as a doctor in any ways?
10. When we last spoke, you mentioned “X” – how is that now?

*Open question to follow up on previous specific “events” or issues” at interviewer discretion.*

11. At the moment, are there any areas where you feel you could do with more support/supervision or teaching to effectively manage your development?

*Prompt: What would you like this support to look like? Have you raised this concern with anyone?*

12. At the moment - what are your overall feelings regarding your choice to study on the LIA course? Has anything changed for you over the last couple of months?

**Final interview only:**

13. What advice would you give to future students who are going to be on the LIA Programme?
14. What are your take home messages from being involved in LIA?
15. Has the LIA influenced your thoughts regarding career choice in any ways? If so how/why?
16. How could we make LIA better for students?

*Please note: these questions are iterative and may evolve in line with this research approach as interviews progress.*
