26.	Derivation of themes	Themes were both identified in advance and derived from the data. The framework of Mountford-Zimdars et al. was used as a guide, but the researchers also allowed the themes to emerge from the data.

28.	Participant checking	No, although all have been sent a copy of the final report and some have replied to say thank you and that they found it interesting.

29.	Quotations presented	Yes we have used quotations to illustrate the themes and participants are identified by the following demographic characteristics: Trainee or Trainer, Stage of training (if trainee), ethnicity, country of primary medical qualification, gender and specialty.
30.	Data and findings consistent	Yes. We have a large amount of from this study, with 137 participants. This paper focuses on the finding in relation to work-life balance, which emerged from the results as an area of significance to trainees. The findings in relation to the research questions around differential attainment have been published in a report for the General Medical Council and a paper for BMJ Open. Other important areas to emerge include the validity of workplace based assessments, and protective and risk processes influencing training progression, which have also be written up for publication.
