Supplementary Text 2 – The Social Support Network Typologies

- 1. The family dependent support network is characterised by close family ties and little contact with friends and neighbours.
- 2. The locally integrated support network includes close relationships with family, relatives, friends, neighbours and high involvement in religious or community activities.
- 3. The locally self-contained support network is described by arm's-length relationships with family and relatives, little involvement in the community and relies primarily on neighbours.
- 4. The wider community-focused support network is classified by absence of local family and relatives, but has active relationships with distant relatives, has many friends and involved in community activities.
- 5. The private restricted support network has a lack of local family and relatives, little contact with neighbours and friends and low level of involvement in community activities.
